### BITS AND PIECES

The mail box hasn't been particularly loaded with general interest information and I don't have anything of a profound (?) nature to say - guess I'll just take off and see what I come up with.

Seems I haven't mentioned for some time the reason why the NMPRA Season Championships run from April I thru October 31. The reason is really very simple - we are trying to be fair to all NMPRA members. They tell me it gets cold up there in Minnesota and New York, as well as a lot of other states North of the Mason-Dixon line, and as a result they don't have too many races between November and March. Now if you start with Florida and go through Texas (as quicklý as possible) to California, you have an area that can pretty well have races all year long and these Southen folk (please insert the honeysuckle accent) would have too much advantage over the Noth. We got to treat them Yankees right or they'll secede. The Northerners are gradually getting their entries up there in their meets but the meet in Fort Worth on March 22–23 had 25 entries and that Fun Fly in Southern California on March 22nd had 28 entries and that would have been a lot of points toward the Championship. I think that you can get the picture, the North wouldn't have a chance against the South's big entry and all year flying conditions if we ran the Season Championships on a calendar year basis. You can accumulate points all year long toward an Exhibition Pilots classification however, so be sure to turn in your points all year long if you haven't made the rating.

I guess I shouldn't say they quit flying Pylon racers in the winter up North. Bud Crane, one of the guys who helped set up the original rules for this event, stopped by the other day. Says he has been flying his Shoestring on skies this winter and that it worked pretty good. Bud thinks that activity is picking up in the Minneapolis area and invites interested people to get in tou with him. His new address is 4224 Winnetka Avenue North, New Hope, Minnesota 55428.

We have had to adjust the rate of inserting contest advertising sheets in the Newsletter. The rate is \$10.00 permaneet of 20 weight paper. The sheet may be printed on both sides - we will probably use the back if it isn't. The method is simple - send 500 copies with a check or money order made out to NMPRA for \$10.00 to NMPRA Newsletter, 729 Falcon Way, Livermore, California 94550. The copy will go out in the first mailing after it is received unless otherwise specified.

Mike Ogilvie, of "Aircraft Quality Products" up in Bellevue, Washington, sent me some pictures of their Loving's Love. One picture was of the original and the other was of the plane that was on display at the Northwest RC Conference. Bob Root built the model from kit parts except for the cheek cowls and the plane looks pretty good. I think that the larger cowls that come with the kit would have really made a winner out if it but it took second place in it's class. Check the February Newsletter for full details on the kit.

NMPRA Officers - Tom Protheroe, Bob Francis and Hal deBolt - are making noises on new products. I got a set of plans from Pappy deBolt for a "Balsa flies Better" deNight Special - can't tell you anymore about it cause he didn't send any message as to whether he plans to market them. Tom Protheroe about has a fiberglas version of the deNight ready to go and hopes to have it ready for the Las Vegas Air Races. It should make a good companion for his "Little Mike" that he currently has on the market. Bob Francis has gone into the fiberglas business for himself and plans to have a "Shoestring" on the market soon. I think he plans to follow that with the "Miss Cosmic Wind" (the midwing job) as well as bring out a line of fiberglas accessories.

The East Bay Radio Controllers noticed a lack of races in May in California and have set up some fun races on May 4th. They plan to use Ed Von Adelungs handicap system and allow any thing that shows up to race. The event will not be AMA Sanctioned and it's just for fun.

Anybody going to be around Memphis, Tennessee on May 10th and 11th? I just received an entry blank from K. K. McClure for the MID-SOUTH FORMULA I PYLON RACING CHAMPIONSHIPS (Sanction #112) and it looks pretty good. Two full days of racing with trophies to fifth place and prize money of \$50.00, \$25.00 and \$15.00. If you think you can make the action, just check the contest schedule for who to contact.

FORT WORTH "THUNDERBIRDS" RC CLUB SPRING RACING MEET - March 22-23 Reporter Bob Lutker

"NEITHER WIND NOR RAIN NOR MUD NOR COLD SHALL....." Those Magnificent Men and Their Flying Machines have just gotta be the most determined group of racing enthusiasts in "captivity". Twenty eight flyers from three states gathered in Fort Worth to make our Spring 1969 meet the largest Pylon Racing competition ever held East of California, with the exception of the Nationals. The turn out, from throughout Texas, Oklahoma and even California was terrific, and the quality of the flying and airplanes was unsurpassed. Racing is here....and it's here to stay....becoming more popular every day.

We had beautiful weather...before the meet...and after the meet. But DURING the meet. ugh! Realizing that the weather in March was always a risk, we gambled - and lost. Saturday morning saw 40° weather blowing from the East, cross wind over the runway, but really not too bad, ranging from 15 to 25 mph wind most of the day. But Sunday? That was something else. Still cold, and awfully windy, changing from the West this time, the 20 to 40 mph wind blew in two different rain storm fronts during the day.

You just never saw more eager pilots. The spirit of competition and sportsmanship was outstanding and everyone appeared to have a great time. Naturally, the high winds washed out many planes on landing, and we seem to have a "magnetic" lone tree that's ofte. decorated with flying aircraft. Some small bit of radio trouble washed out or otherwise damaged quite a few planes. A total of 9 models dropped out of the racing...some just dropped out of the sky.

The open Pylon event attracted only 6 entries, with Jody McDaniel of Dallas taking the 1st place trophy, Sam Fly (he's an airline pilot too) winning 2nd and Dave Webb taking 3rd place. All three winners being from Dallas made it their event with Fo t Worth entries at a low. It appears that Open Pylon, with little interest being shown, will be relagated to "fun" meets in the future.

The Formula II events attracted even less interest. There's a lot of talk going on around the nation about this event...but that's all. The "flyers" are staying with the faster 450's. The 3 lone entries flew for the 3 "lone" trophies. Curtis Brownlee raced his 600 sq. inch deBolt Mustang to first place, leaving Oklahoma City far out in front of the other two entries, hailing from Houston. Wayne Walters Shoestring with a Super Tigre RR 40 placed 2nd and Houston's Don Yockey, flying his new "Little Toot" bi-plane was awarded 3rd place trophy. We're willing to give Formula II one more chance in our October meet to make a showing, but so far, three entires at each of our meets just isn't enough to justify the event.

And now, getting down to the "big boy" event as it's known in racing circles, Formula ! was the big attraction. Of the 25 entries in this event, at least 8 were new to the racing game. And even with their limited experience and the not so good weather, they did particularly well racing against some of the nations' top contenders.

We were honored with the participation of California's Joe Bridi, who is a terrific competitor and just an awfully nice guy. Joe's Minnow was probably the fastest entry in the meet, but bad luck kept him from the winners circle. It's obvious that he is a real competition man, but he also has a rare "good sportsman" attitude that really makes life worth living for a battle weary CD. But then this racing seems to bring out the best in most all of our pilots, for I've seen some of the greatest examples of good sportsmanship in model aviation among the racing fraternity. Racing started as a "gentlemens" game.... and let's keep it that way.

In spite of the high winds, speeds were amazing, with one heat showing Houston's Jack Beauchmap piloting his "Little Mike" to a time of I minute 52 seconds flat, and many of the heats saw times near that.

I very strongly feel that Pylon meets should always go to 10 rounds whenever possible, but this time around, the weather on Sunday held us to a total of 7 rounds. Even so the winners were pretty well obvious throughout the meet, but the competition was keen all the way. Houston had a team of some of the finest racing pilots anywhere, with old timer Bill Anderson winning 1st place, just I point ahead of Fort Worth's Ed Rankin. Everyone had their share of bad luck and the loss of consistency kept many of the racing "pros" from that top honor. Pilots like Dr. Bob Pearce, Jack Beauchamp, Don Yockey, Joe Bridi, Ben Beerbower, John Locke, Curtis Brownlee, all plagued with the odds of poor luck.

There's a great future for Pylon Racing, now that it has finally "gotten off the ground" for at last we have a real "SPORT" in model aviation.

The THUNDERBIRD members came through with flying colors in turning out to staff this meet. It takes a lot of people working a lot of hours to pull off a successful racing meet, and now that there are so many THUNDERBIRD members racing....and needing callers, it's doubly difficult to secure meet personnel. I estimate the 25 contest officials worked about 324 man hours during the two days of the racing, not including advance planning and preparation or "after the contest" clean-up. Of course we had problems arise and probable errors occur, but all the contestants accepted any difficulties in the very best sportsmanlike manner. It's a difficult event to manage and administer and since we all know that, it makes my job as Contest Director a most enjoyable one. And with meet officials like the THUNDERBIRDS and even volunteer helpers from out of town, like Bill Aaker from Dallas and Will Cowan from Austin and many, many others, it was a real pleasure. My hat is off to all you fellows...and you all know what a "glare" problem that creates.

In our advance planning last year for this meet, the first of the racing season, we honestly thought attendance would be light, so we announced in our brochure that there would be no banquet. Well Sir, as we began to get word from you fellows that you were coming to fly in our March meet, we realized that it would be much larger than expected. Sooooo....we changed our plans and endedup having a most enjoyable banquet on Saturday night.

Most of the wives were there too, at least I brought most of mine, and a fine time was had by all. Joe Bridi showed his South Africa flying tour films and the running commentary by Helmer Johnson and other "loud mouths" was a real delight. It seems that Joe had filmed some African Baboons doing their antics and Helmer just had to brag about his relatives. But it was great fun. Ye Ole CD (commonly called Seedy) had a few appropriate quips and words about the meet thus far and it was a happy but weary group heading back for some quick plane repairs and tuneups after THUNDERBIRD President Ed Rankin bid them farewell for the night.

About 65 were present for the festivities. Our banquet has become a tradition at our THUNDERBIRD meets, for we all enjoy the good fellowship of our fellow members and it's gratifying to get acquainted with many of their families.


