Last month I mentioned the work being done on a Quarter Midget Contest Directors survey. We now have 65% of the questionaires returned and they are still trickling in. We thought 40% would be phenominal. It just goes to prove the interest in QM rules.

Using the results of the QM-CD survey, we determined where the areas of conflict were and devised another survey to deal with them specifically. Because of the scope and controversy involved with the new survey questions, we wanted the average QM flier to become involved with the decisions.

Don Dombrowski of "Racing at Random" has solved our survey coverage problem by running the QM "Fliers Questionaire" in the June issue of RCM. (On the newsstands in May) Its results should provide us us with a substantial data base on which to build our 1978 AMA rule proposals. It should also provide enough time to write the rule proposals if we get the results back quickly. The June 1 deadline date is still our target but there are strong indications that it has been moved back to September 1.

We are still accepting bids for the 76 NMPRA-QM Championships.

First of all, I would like to say "Thank You" for electing me your representative to present the views of the Northeast to the national organization. It looks like 1976 will be a banner year for our area, There are 20 races scheduled to be run, including a Northeast district Championships, to be held at Somers, NY on October 9 th and 10 th.

There have been some changes made in the "SPORTSMAN" rules for 1976.

The changes are as follows:(1) NMPRA Point System will be used for determining winner of the annual high point trophy.

(2) Best 6 races will be used to determine season winners.

(3) Cutoff time still 1.50, But Sportsman need not move to Expert until breaking 1.50 at 3 contests (rather than 3 heats as in 1975). I personally think Bob Noll has done a tremendous job in getting the "Sportsman" event off the ground. Also I think Walt Schroder of MAN deserves a big hand for donating trophies that are awarded to the top three sportsman at each race. Due to the last minute changes and additions of races, I have listed a final copy of the races to be run along with the events to be held. I am certain that this schedule is correct because I spent two days talking to each clubs representative at the recent WRAMS show. Finally I have decided to appoint three people to be AVP's of certain sections of the northeast I felt this was necessary because of the large size of our district which makes communication difficult, so if you have any comments or gripes to make get in touch with the AVP in your area or myself.

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
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
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
