Rules & Proposals

Hello. We've just completed the most recent two-year rules cycle for RC Pylon and the AMA rules that govern it. The revised rules define what our sport will look like starting on January 1, 2015. We had an active cycle with a total of 17 change proposals. Many of the proposals were simply making corrections where our rules just didn't reflect the reality of our sport today, and others were proposing some significant changes. One of the proposals that addressed some issues with the Event 424 Sport Quickie rules was replaced with an urgent proposal with several adjustments to 424 so that the changes would be in place for holding the class at the AMA NATS for the first time this past summer. Ultimately, 12 of the remaining 16 proposals passed the initial vote and all 12 of those passed the final vote.

As the Chairman of the RC Pvlon Board. I want to thank all of the Board members for their contributions to our sport as representatives of each of the AMA districts. They have served you all well. We have a Board, full of active, interested, and involved members who truly care about our sport. We all have our own opinions and that's good. We had some very good discussions about them and had the language vetted pretty well by the time most of them were officially submitted. I think it was a very productive cycle and our events will be better from the effort.

I also want to thank all of you who took the time to study the proposals and provide feedback to your Board members. I know I received a lot of very good feedback from the racers in my district that when tallied, completely agreed with how the final vote results came out. Thanks to everyone who was part of the process.

Rather than take the time and space in the newsletter to go over all 12 of the proposals that passed, I'll just touch on a few of them. The proposals are still on the AMA Competitions site. The rules will be revised accordingly and posted before the end of the year.

The proposal that probably resulted in the most discussion among the Board members was the change to the way the required engine exposure was defined in QM 422. The current rule required a minimum of 3/4" of the cylinder and head be fully exposed outside of the fuselage. This creates a problem when the two approved engines for the class are different heights from the engine mounting surface to the top of the cylinder head, if a model is designed to the maximum extent of the rule using the taller of the two engines. This makes that model unable to meet the rule with the shorter engine brand. The proposal was to redefine this feature to be measured from the centerline of the crankshaft to the outside of the fuselage. The dimension will now be defined as 1.94" (1 15/16") as measured perpendicular to the plane of the engine mount flanges. This way, it's the same for both engine manufacturers. The 1.94" was selected because it equals the result of a fuselage designed around the shorter of the two approved engines under the old rule, making models that were legal under the old rule with both engine brands still legal.

Many of the rest of the proposals were for cleaning up of things that weren't in line any more with how races are being done today. As an example, the transmitter antenna rule was written for our old radio equipment and if followed to the letter, made using 2.4 Ghz radios illegal because their antennas are not collapsible or removable. Also, RCP 15-15 required that a flag be used to launch a race when a good portion of our races are being operated with Judgeman style systems (Thank You, Hank Kaufmann!!!!) that launch the race with system controlled lights. In addition, the standard method of mounting 2.4Ghz receivers these days is Velcro, which was not allowed. We found several more areas that just needed some fine tuning like that,

which really just brought our rules in line with what we were already doing.

Two proposals were passed that addressed performance records by adjusting the back-up time percentage and documentation requirements, along with setting specific criteria for when a record should be re-set following a change to our rules.

There were also a couple of others that addressed QM 422 propellers. One being a minimum diameter for all propellers for the class and the other eliminating the allowance for wood propellers all together.

Something that came up in the discussion about setting a new minimum diameter for QM props is, just because the new rule minimum diameter of 7.3 inches is slightly less than the diameter of the currently approved APC composite propellers, it does NOT mean racers can cut the tips to shorten their propellers to that diameter. The STOCK requirement is still in place which means the diameter MUST still remain STOCK as they came out of the bag. That rule was not changed.

Why did we need this rule? Because QM is catching on all around the world through the new and very similar FAI F3T class, making QM a much bigger market and much more inviting for another manufacturer to make propellers for the event. While all of our approved APC propellers are defined as 7.4" in diameter (and measure a little less than that), allowing new propellers to be brought into our event with smaller diameters could open up a level of performance that would have damaging effects on the event and potentially decrease our current safety level through increased speeds, neither of which would be good for our sport.

Putting a minimum diameter in place effectively limits performance because a given diameter propeller can only be turned so fast before it starts running into transonic tip speed efficiency problems, effectively limiting RPM's and speeds. In the long run, this will be good for our sport.

That's all I think I need to touch on for now other than thanks again for all who participated in the process. I think the result is a great set of rules that will keep our sport healthy for a long time to come.

District 1: Tom Hegland


Greetings District One! I'm back! Good news as I'm in recovery from my work addiction. It's been a challenging fight as I take my recovery one day at a time. Many, many months ago (March) there was a race, a 3-pole pylon race in Whittier, California. This race was the inaugural Denis Lvon Memorial Race hosted by the San Gabriel Valley Radio Control League. A big thanks to Dan Thordarson, Mario Salazar, Dave Gavin, Dan Coe, Tom Dooley, and many others I'm forgetting (I struggle remembering what occurred yesterday let alone 6 months ago) to bring AMA racing back to the Whittier venue. Saturday saw 50 entries and Sunday 33 entries in AMA 424, 426, and Q40 classes. The event team mentioned above used some innovative approaches to improve racing efficiency. One big improvement the event team implemented was to significantly reduce the time it takes to transition from short course to long course and back again. These guys came up with a scheme to have Pylon 1 workers on a flatbed trailer which was then towed via a truck. In addition. a dual-purpose dirt bike was utilized to quickly move Pylon 1 as appropriate for the two-course layout.

Let's get racing! AMA 424 had a good turnout on Saturday with 17 pilots, and the first heat got under way slightly after 9:00 am. After two rounds Mitch West, Chuck Thompson, Jim Padelt, and Bruce Coffey were all clean. Dan Duffy was the fast guy in the morning with a 1:23.39. Bill Malo seemed to have the fastest 424 machine but couldn't complete a clean 10 laps. In round 3 Dan Coe picked up the pace with a 1:20.62, and Bill Malo finally had a clean heat and posted a 1:21.42. At the end of round 4, Mitch West, Jim Padelt, and Pietro Palumbo were in tie for 1st place. The fly-off for Saturday's 424 "Wood" saw Mitch West barely edging out Jim Padele and Pietro Palumbo taking 3rd Place.

As I recall, Padelt was not real happy with his caller in that fly-off (my bad). Round 1 AMA 426 on Saturday had Travis Flynn leading the pack with a round one fast time of 1:03.87. He was followed closely by Jim Allen with a 1:05.92. Round 2 seemed to have that "Whittier Fast Air" arrive as just about everybody posted improved round 1 times. Travis lowered his fast time to 1:03.04, and Tony Lopez bettered his round 1 time by over four seconds, taking over 2nd place. In round 3, Jim Allen lowered his time down to 1:03.72 and Sam San turned a 1:05.75. When the burned Ritches Brew fumes settled, it was Travis Flynn on top followed by Jim Allen and Tony Lopez. In Q-40 Matias Salar dominated from the first flag drop to the final round. In round 1, Matias ran away from everybody and turned a 1:01.23, which turned out to be the fast time for the day. As the day's Q40 racing evolved, lots of name changes for the 2nd and 3rd place spots. I noted David Lloyd, Gary Schmidt, Rusty Van Baren, Dan Thordarson, and Chuck Andraka were all battling for those spots behind Matias. After 4 rounds it took a fly-off between Dan Thordarson and Chuck Andraka to finalize the 2nd and 3rd place positions. Dan bested Chuck in this one to take the 2nd place trophy. Fast competitive racing all day with everybody in the top 6 posting a 1:03.xx or better.

Bring on Sunday! Another great job by the San Gabriel Valley Radio Control League workers getting set up and organized as the first heat was underway by 9:30 am. AMA 424 entries were only eight on Sunday; whether 8 or 80 this was going to be Dan Coe's day to shine. Round 1 saw Mr. Coe put up a 1:20.67, followed closely by Tom Skavinsky with a 1:21.64. Dan and Tom cruised in the remaining 4 rounds to end up in a tie for 1st Place. The fly-off for 1st looked as if it was going to be good; however, Tom Skavinsky cut out by lap 5 trying to keep up with Mr. Coe. Jim Padelt managed to stay one point off the pace to pick up 3rd Place.

In Q-40, Dan Coe made things interesting by winning his first two heats. Could a three-peat be possible? Unfortunately, Dan picked up a zero in round 3 to put him back in the middle of the pack. This day turned out to be a good one for team Van Baren & Killebrew. Both Doug and Rusty managed to drop a point in round two, but that was the end of dropping any additional points. In the end it was Rusty in 1st Place, Doug in 2nd Place, and Jim Lime picking up third. I believe I heard Jim mention this was his first Q-40 trophy. Congratulations, Jim!



District 3: Randy Smith






District 4: Travis Elbert



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
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
