

### District 4: Travis Elbert

Hello Fellow NMPRA members,

In this article I thought I would tackle basics for upping the performance of your Ef1 Arf. Over the last few years I have heard several racers complain that the ARF's are not as competitive as the kit built aircraft. Although as a builder you have more quality control over the end product, there is a massive amount of time commitment for an aircraft that usually has a limited lifespan. ARF's are a great way to race with less time involved and a few little tricks can help. I am a prolific builder but at times have defaulted to ARF's to keep playing, and I have assembled most of the ARF's. The aircraft I have been playing with is the Nitroplanes Miss Dara. Originally when they came out, it had the tragic flaw of a weak wing spar (although most of the ARF's suffered from this); they were heavy and many had twisted wings. My first mostly stock Dara (recovered, better spar) weighed in at almost four pounds, and no matter how many times I fixed the twist in the wing it came back; I finally had to cut it to fix the instance.

Weigh ARF with all major components (electronics, motor, battery) before assembly. This gives you a good idea of your all-up weight. If it is on the heavy side, there are several options. Strip the covering, lighten the airframe and recover. On the Dara the fuse and tail feathers are heavy. Also when your airframe is mostly assembled, move the radio gear around to get your CG correct; then you will not have added weight. In the Dara I moved the elevator and rudder servos at the back of the fuse.

Always check the instance on your wings, then wings to stabilizer. Make sure the wings and tail feathers are square to the fuse and each other. Straight planes fly better and are faster. Every trim costs you drag.

Trust yourself; if something does not look right, it probably is not right. Case in point, if you can bend the spar, it will bend or fold under a load. Cheesy plastic standoffs on the motor to



the firewall should be replaced with stacked plywood or 3d printed standoffs; this cuts down on vibrations.

My second Miss Dara after a diet and some tweaking came in at 3.57 pounds all up weight. It flies straight and is fast. A little extra time assembling your ARF will make it more competitive.





### **Pylon Racing in Queensland Australia**

It was time to get the dust off the models and cobwebs from the exhausts to commence the 2018 QMARA pylon racing season at the Maryborough Aero Modellers Club on the Fraser Coast. The new championship point season commenced as well, and pilots were keen to be top of the leader board at the end of the weekend. The diehards of racing were there: Bruce deChastel, Tony Singleton, Andrew Wall, Karl Harrod, Steve Taylor, etc.

The event was held on the Australia Day long weekend with hot and humid conditions with attendance down a little from our last meeting in December at the same venue. This was mainly due probably to the long weekend and the heat and humidity. All classes were run over the two-day event with Q500, F3R, F3T, F5D and F3D pilots enjoying their time going round the poles.

There were some surprising results with an unexpected last place for Team BBR's (Bruce deChastel) Chief Pilot and current 2015 World Air Games Champion in F3T coming in last. You don't see that in many events he enters. This gave some of the others a chance to grab some glory with Tony SINGLETON topping the table in F3T and F3D, Andrew WALL took out the F3R, Marc HAMILTON Q500 and Team BBR finally had a win in F5D, albeit he being the only competitor with a time on the clock. Team BBR headed off to Indonesia next for their F3R International Pylon Race Championship in







Surabaya. In conjunction with the local pylon community an FAI Judge/Jury training camp was held prior to the weekend's racing and formal qualification certificates issued at the conclusion of the camp by Bruce and Mr Vissut Ampaivorn of the Royal Aeronautic Sports Association of Thailand. There were many happy students at the completion and eager to get out to the course and put into practice what they had learnt. Along with single entrant participation in the international racing, teams of three were gathered to further enhance the competition. Bruce teamed up with Ahmad NUGROHO and Eko Arif SETIAWAN and lo and behold "Team BBR Indonesia" ran out the winners with a combined score of 1154.20 to 1167.05 for the second place getters.









Bruce also took out the overall winner and fastest time 74.0. He also donated a kit for the juniors in attendance; winner was drawn out of the hat. To see the winners' faces and parents' faces was a joy. The father and son combinations at the event show that pylon racing in Indonesia is strong and growing.

### Official Scrutineering in Indonesia

Prior to the local racing getting back on track QMARA members Andrew WALL, Danny GILES and who would have guessed Bruce deChastel (Team BBR) again headed overseas to New Zealand this time







to contest the Trans-Tasman Q40/F3R trophies. Missing unfortunately was Marc HAMILTON as his passport didn't arrive in time for him to head on over to compete. Bruce and Andrew's partners took care of the touristy duties whilst the serious stuff was being conducted at the field and stayed on the field. The Trans-Tasman Trophy was lost to New Zealand this time round, but arrangements are being made with a view of this becoming more of an annual event. After competing in ten rounds Q40 winners were Team BBR 1<sup>st</sup> with 517.3, 2<sup>nd</sup> Frazer BRIGGS (NZ) 550.8. Andrew was 8<sup>th</sup> and Danny 9<sup>th</sup>. In F3R Jarrod BRIGGS (NZ) 596.0, Team BBR 2<sup>nd</sup> 599.3; it was that 200 that cost him the Quinella in round five, Andrew 7<sup>th</sup> and Danny 8<sup>th</sup> placings. From all reports it was worth the time to go overseas to compete. Put this one on your calendar in future. QMARA will post when dates are known.





Back on the home scene the second round of racing commenced in April @ Maryborough again and saw more pilots turn up for some racing along with the yearly AGM to see who gets to steer the boat for the next twelve months. Current President Tyler Mees was re-elected, Vice President Neil Davy, Karen Callow Secretary/Treasurer, Contest Director Steve Taylor, Safety Officer Chris Watt.

Bruce deChastel (Team BBR) was back to his best claiming the top spot in F3R & F5D (56.97 fastest time); Q500 was Marc HAMILTON's domain again; former FAI World Champion Chris Callow was at the top of his game taking out the F3D and after dropping one round all his times were under 59.18 seconds. With the 2019 World Championships coming to Australia in 2019, I'm sure he will be up to the task of the qualifying rounds being conducted around the country in 2018. The F3T was hotly contested with some excellent racing between Karl HARROD and his new "CAUDRON" model against Team BBR and his GR7 with Karl being the dominator on the day by 1.7 seconds overall. Nathan MITCHELL was a distant 3<sup>rd</sup> some eleven seconds behind.



As two members of QMARA (Bruce deChastel & Tony SINGLETON) are off to the World F5D championships being held Takikawa, Japan in July 2018, a donation was given to assist with travel etc., and we wish them all the best in their endeavours overseas competing in another World Championship.

A break from the local season again saw Bruce deChastel and Andrew WALL (QMARA members) take their partners on a trip to Japan for some more touring, sightseeing, and local culinary delights with a side dish of some Q40 racing at the hotly contested yearly tournament at the Kizu Flying Club (better known as the KFC club) in April. This was the 8th KFC Q40 International Pylon Race. Bruce attends each year and fellow pylon racers are always welcome to tag along. Arriving on Thursday, practice Friday, racing Saturday/Sunday and departure back to Australia on Monday. Surprises were not the order of finishing, and Team BBR was on top of the table after 13 rounds of racing with 625.47 and 2<sup>nd</sup> place with 646.83. This was also the international debut of a new model for Bruce the "Caudron" with a fastest time of 60.57.









Andrew finished in 7<sup>th</sup> place out of 17 entrants a great effort with a final score of 694.63. Next meeting for some QMARA members were the 70<sup>th</sup> MAAA National championships at West Wyalong in NSW. Danny GILES, Marc HAMILTON, Steve TAYLOR (and partner Jo), Mick DALLMAN and Steve HUGHES ventured south for a round trip of some 2,600k's to compete in Q500, F400, and F3T classes.







Arriving on the usual Thursday, practice Friday after setting up the course and the competition commencing Saturday/Sunday on offer. Steve TAYLOR (F3T/Q500), Mick (F3T), Danny, Marc, and Steve entered the Q500, F3T, and F400 racing and assisted with the other general duties that go with pylon racing manning the cage at #1 pylon and cut lines at #2 and #3 pylons. Mick DALLMAN did a fantastic job of Contest Director for the whole event. The opposition was mainly made up of VMPRA members that are regularly seen on Facebook and now you could put a face to those names. Danny 5th, Marc 6<sup>th</sup> and Steven 8<sup>th</sup> in the F400 class., Steven TAYLOR 1<sup>st</sup> in F3T with an overall time of 445.99 to 2<sup>nd</sup> place Barry Murphy on 459, Danny 3<sup>rd</sup>, Steve HUGHES 4<sup>th</sup>, and Marc 5<sup>th</sup>, Mick 6<sup>th</sup>. Q500, Marc 3<sup>rd</sup>, Danny 9<sup>th</sup> and Steve 10<sup>th</sup>. Cuts & 200's don't go well with putting times on the board and having reliable engines are a must. MAAA presented some medallions and callers also got one as a nice touch. After some hiccups with the venue and setting the course up, it was worth the trip south to compete.

Back on scene in Queensland. Round Three commenced at the Suncoast Model Flyers on the Sunshine Coast the week after the Nationals. F3R was a close contest between Greg GILLES, Team BBR (69.55), and President Tyler with scores of 436.2, 436.3 and 438.1 respectively. Eight rounds were flown which were thoroughly enjoyed by all rather than the normal five rounds. F3D was taken out by Chris CALLOW with no time slower than 57.22 and a best of 55.80. Sunday's weather was challenging to say the least but the wind was down the strip for take-offs. Q500 changed hands with Chris WOOD being the winner. F5D was taken out by Andrew RANKIN. 200's were the order of the day in this contest, new models being tested, etc. F3T was the final event of the weekends meet. Team BBR was back to form and took revenge on Greg GILLES and Tony SINGLETON both tying for 2<sup>nd</sup>. Fastest time was Karl HARROD with a 60.24 with his Caudron model and with three of them competing it appears to be no slouch over the 180m. Next round of racing just after midwinter's solstice in the southern hemisphere at Maryborough.



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




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
