Membership Renewals







In the case of SAS stabilization/gyros etc, we have chosen to follow the AMA ruling as set out in the AMA rule book for pylon racing. I.e., we will allow stabilization in District 3 until things change at the AMA level. As spring is now well on us, I'm excited for another great season of racing in our district. I'll see you at the start line.

District 5: Jim Nikodem

Racing season will have started by the time this is published. The first event in district five once again is Pylon Racing School at the AMA facility in Muncie. Thanks again to Tom Melsheimer for coming up with the idea and hosting the event. It is a great opportunity for those who want to give three-pole pylon racing a try. It is also a great opportunity for test flights on those new airplanes. The primary focus, however, is mentoring new racers. Three weeks later is the first Muncie race mid-May. Many thanks to Scott Farnsworth for not only putting the race on as CD, but being president of CAPS.



I get calls and emails from time to time on EF1 recommendations. There are all kinds of ways to look at this event, but to me, the key is practice and battery. I concentrate on a straight, slowly-climbing takeoff where I gradually take the right rudder out. I usually do not have anyone around to launch the airplane. It works for me to gun the throttle with some right rudder on a hard surface. I then chop the power and land, and repeat about 7-8 times. This brings up my second point: be nice to your batteries. I have practice batteries and competition batteries. Practice batteries have at least two seasons as competition batteries and are starting to get a little tired. By the way, I have flown eight EF1 contests each year for a long time, so my batteries get used. I fly 11 laps at a race or practice and land. Any more and you are starting to hurt the batteries. I am happy to discuss EF1. Everyone has his own philosophy, but mine has worked well. By the way, I have never used stabilization of any kind, but it might be helpful on the rudder in this event. Some EF1's are prone to snap rolling at low speed with a high power setting. This includes takeoff and go around. The picture is one of the better EF1 ARF's currently available. There are many EF1 kits also.



In 2019, we will have the "Pete Reed Q-500 Classic" on Saturday August 3rd and Sunday 4th 2019. Our traditional after-race picnic will follow. Thank you in advance to all who will help to put on this race. We will race both AMA 424 and AMA 426 both on Saturday and on Sunday. There still hasn't been a lot of outdoor flying around the Kansas City area yet; up until just recently it was below normal cold and windy! The weather is starting to get better; we might even get some spring weather this year!

While it's not exactly district 8, being on the Missouri side, there's a race being thrown by Duane Hulen and the KCRC (Kansas City RC) club at their field by Lake Jacomo in KC. I don't see it in the NMPRA schedule yet, but I have it down as the 27th & 28th of April, and it's 424 / 426 racing. The format is two one-day races in each class, so if you can't make it both days, you can still have a shot at the trophies! Duane and the club throw a good race with good helpers, and I'm sure that he'd appreciate us all supporting the race if possible.

Lonnie Finch and Roger Burright are hard at work getting ready for the Tallman legacy race this September also. That race will be at Lake Afton Park near Goddard KS, which is just to the west of Wichita. Draws a good crowd, and it's a good race to attend. Pencil that one into your calendars, for sure. It's a 422 only race, and Wichita is a pretty good place for a race – concrete takeoff pad, asphalt runway for landing, and a parallel grass runway you can use if you want. The race is the $21^{st}/22^{nd}$ of September, with the field typically open for practice on Friday the 20^{th} . There's a race flyer in the NMPRA calendar for that one with more details.

Finally – the dates aren't set, but the RC Barnstormers club that flies at Hillsdale Lake just southwest of the Kansas City area is trying to schedule a 424/426 race at their field. Dates aren't firmed up yet, but it's looking like sometime after the Nats and before the Tallman race. Trying to make sure we don't interfere with other races like the Colorado fall race (another good one to attend).

Time to get that pre-season maintenance done, if you haven't already. Check servo mounting hardware (and the trays/mounts in the plane), control links (replace any that are marginal or worn), hinges, fuel tubing/tank plumbing, things like that. I have a Polecat Q40 that's getting up there in years, and I had to lay up a new layer of glass/epoxy on the rudder hinge line; it was cracking and getting somewhat sloppy. Check your wing hold downs, both in the wing (check for cracked dowels/hard points, etc.) and in the fuse; repair as needed. I'm sure you can think of a dozen or more other things to check, but a little maintenance ahead of time can possibly save having to replace a plane unexpectedly!

Finally – as you're out racing or just practicing even, snap a picture or two and e-mail them to me; I can probably squeeze some into the articles from time to time, and who doesn't like pictures?



Pylon Racing in Australia by Steven Hughes

Roundup of all things that GO FAST and TURN Left in Queensland. Our latest event was held on the 2nd & 3rd March with all classes being raced and most importantly the F5D Team Trials for the 2019 RC Pylon World Championships. Weather forecast was for wind and chance of rain. Both of those weather events did happen and made conditions challenging for most of the weekend. It was 15kts down the strip and gusting at times 20kts or more. Only one race heat had the pilots stranded mid-race with rain showering upon them, and they looked very cold on their return to the pits. The sun ventured out once again and dried them and the race area out as well.

Friday was setup day for all pilots who were in attendance along with official F5D scrutineering to be done. All models were weighed, failsafes checked, range checks, limiters checked, and batteries checked. Models reassembled, and test flown again and ready for action on Saturday. First up on Saturday were the F5D Team Trials participants with nine in total attempting to qualify in the Top Three. Neil Davy, Steven Hughes, Richard Brough, Tony Singleton, Stephen Turna, Tyler Mees, Bruce de Chastel, Trevor Pearce, and David Wilkins.

Eight rounds of racing with five heats per round and drop your worst two rounds. Two up racing was the call of the day as well one round with a single pilot. Only one race meet to get it right. Big Bruce Racing Dominators seemed to be the model of choice to have along with some Avioniks and a mixture of two-bladed and single-bladed propulsion devices.

The pits were awash with various emotions from the F5D contenders preparing to go to the line to race the clock. After Round One some mixed results showed upon the faces of some pilots. With no Q500 between rounds the F5D pilots and their callers were moving at a frantic pace on the ground and in the air getting through in record time. A review of proceedings at the halfway mark saw the top contenders for the three spots move to the head of the field. Top of the pack was the ever reliable Bruce de Chastel (Caller Tony Singleton) 186.8, Tyler Mees (Caller Warren Mees) (placed 4th in the F3D Australian Team Trials) giving it another shot at making an Australian Team in pylon racing 187.4, Stephen Turna (Caller Chris Callow) returning after a sabbatical up north for three years in Townsville (where pylon racing is non-existent) 192.3, Tony Singleton (Caller Bruce de Chastel) attempting back to back F5D Team Australia selection 195.4, and Richard Brough (caller Steve Hughes) making his first attempt at qualifying 195.6. Some 8.8 seconds between the Top Five.

Next half of proceedings saw batteries on charge, props being changed, data being downloaded from ESC's, fine tuning to get that extra RPM out of the model for that extra second.

I don't have the times after the penultimate round had been completed but 1st and 2nd had been secured by Bruce (364.5 overall) and Tyler (368.3 overall). The final round of the competition would determine 3rd place between Stephen 390.11 and Tony 388.04. Some 2.07 seconds separated them. Both walked out to the line with world class callers in Bruce and Chris (both World Champions); how appropriate for the trials to come down to this. "On the clock" was called, and the Starter called



"Launch One," "Launch Two," and the ten-lap battle ensued at breakneck speed. In a blink of an eye and less than 65 seconds later, it was all over. Tony finished with a 61.67 and Stephen with a 63.45. Tony maintained his lead. Timekeepers then had the task to drop another round to give six final round scores out of the eight to tally up and provide the pilots, callers, and spectators who were doing their own best math in their heads at the same time to reveal 3rd placing.

Results were posted, and Tony held onto 3rd place with a 382.0 (overall) with Stephen a gallant 4th placing with a 384.6 (overall). The deciding factor was Tony had 1 cut out of 8 rounds and Stephen had 2 cuts overall. It all came down to cuts.

Well done to all who did participate, and after ratification of models and times it was declared that Bruce de Chastel, Tyler Mees, and Tony Singleton were to represent Australia at the upcoming 2019 World Pylon Racing Championships.

Almost forgot to mention that elusive fast time that every pilot wants at each meet where they compete. Best time was Bruce de Chastel with a sub 57s time of 56.7 seconds. The excitement on Bruce's face was a sight to see. Pretty good for a single bladed, 5 cell powered electric motor and weighing in at 1000grams.

Oh, yes, there was some other racing going on the weekend with some F3D also putting in five rounds with former World Champion Chris Callow fine tuning his flight packages for the World Championships being qualifier Number One for the Australian F3D Team. From sitting at the timing station and looking at Chris's times, it was a sight to behold and the conditions he was flying in as well (strong head wind). I think he took it on as a challenge to take the fast time of the day and the meet overall and bettered Bruce's F5D fast time of 56.7 by 1.03s setting a time of 55.67s. Job Done, now to just complete the meet without any incidents I bet he thought.

F3R class was first up on Sunday with some very frantic and exciting racing going on around the poles with Steve and Danny having some dandy time to-ing and fro-ing between each being called the Demolition Brothers, but all flights ended without incident and Greg Gilles picked up the quickest with a 72.42.

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


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
