Last year the rules used for Sportsman Pylon Racing were printed in the NMPRA Newsletter. Basically, this event was developed to provide an entry class into racing for those people not yet competent enough to run high nitro and race with the experts. In "Sportsman", the nitro is restricted to 15%, but any FAI, Formula II, Formula I ship is allowed. A cut-off time of 1:50 is used, and any Sportsman flyer who hits 1:50 or under three times must move into the Expert class. Other details are similar to Formula I except starting positions are determined by draw. Below are the District II Sportsman final standings. Also included is a Sportsman Pylon Questionaire. 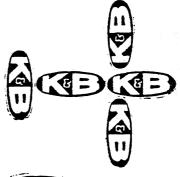

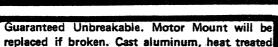

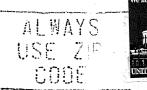
