Take time out for the family because the racing season will soon be here.



Results from a nationwide survey of QM Contest Directors should all be in and evaluated by the time you read this message. An in-depth, 84 item, questionaire was formulated and mailed in mid-January to all the CD's who held an AMA sanctioned QM contest in the last two and half years. Questionairs were also circulated among California QM-CD's who do not generally have AMA sanction. Lack of names and addresses of non-sanctioned CD's prevented a more extensive survey.

From a participation standpoint, the survey was a complete success. Within 5 mailing days, 28% of the survey was returned and results are still coming in as I write this. Professional survey takers consider 40% to border on the phenominal and we should exceed that easily. To all the people participating, my personal thanks and gratitude.

The CD survey will serve as a basis for supplimental flier surveys. The combined survey results will be made public and serve as a data bank for the NMPRA-QM Rules Committee. We again ask your cooperation in filling out the flier survey carefully and getting it to us quickly. AMA Rules for 1978 must be proposed by June 1, this year.

Any Racing News Letter editors interested in exchanging newsletters with other racing organizations, please get me your name and address. I will publish them as I get them. Communication is very important for a growing organization.

We are interested in your comments and opinions on the 2 class QM system. To my knowledge it has been successful everywhere it has been tried. For definition purposes we will divide the classes into Standard (low key, low cost, sporting competition) and Expert (experienced racers aiming at maximum performance). 


