Happy New Year, District One. Well, I am just starting to warm up after an unbelievably cold weekend Phoenix, Arizona, where over 60 of us competed at the 2007 Winterfest Q500 race. I have been going to the Winterfest race for over a dozen years, and I can say undoubtedly that this was the coldest, wettest one yet. Even though the temps were in the 40's, the Phoenix club and workers did a fantastic job still getting us 7 rounds of racing. I think even in perfect weather the plan was to go only 8 rounds so we can't thank them enough.

Now to the racing action. This year it seemed that we had some new faces, including a whole group from District 2. Some of these guys have been here before, but they seemed to be

more in force this year. I don't think I have seen Eric Ide before, but he was hanging tough with a lot of the top guns and flying great. Another guy that I think is officially hooked is Scott Causey, who is an RC combat pilot and friend of AJ Seaholm. I saw him already eying a Q40. It also looks as if we have a new guy from our district or I guess I should say returning to it: George Peiro, he and his brother looked as if they had a good time even in the cold weather.

I'll start with AMA 428. After four rounds of racing Saturday the standings were very close with many guys only one or two points down. Sunday things would change though. After rounds five and six many guvs had a few cuts and even a few more with the dreaded double cut and collecting the zero. So after the seventh round Gary Schmidt was on top, down only one point (to Scott McAfee) and received the big Kachina trophy. Jim Allen and Randy Bridge were tied for second and third, and after a fly-off Jim got the second spot. The fourth through eighth spots were also tied for points. So after some discussions with the five pilots, the decision was to race it as the drags do and have an A/B format fly-off. The fast guy flies the slow guy. So Craig Grunkemeyer and Gino Del Ponte raced first with Gino winning and advancing. Next would be Fred Burgdorf, Matias Salar, and Lee Von Der Hey. Lee lost his plane in the first few laps so Fred and Matias finished it to the end with Matias coming out on top. Now to the final fly-offs, which started with the B group and the sixth and seventh place which included Fred and Craig. Lee would have been in this, but losing his plane, he didn't take out a backup so he got the eighth spot and also the fast time trophy. In the race Craig got one cut, and Fred took the win. Now the A group of Matias and Gino would fly-off for the fourth and fifth spot. These guys had a very close race with Matias coming out on top. These were very cool flyoffs to watch, and these five guys got a few more flights in for sure.

District 3, Richard Moldenhauer

Hello, everyone. It's another cold, snowy winter in Canada with racing pretty much shut down. So what to write for Linda's newsletter this time around? How about a little building tip. Building? Who does that any more? I guess it's more of an assembly tip since most of our models these days are highly prefabricated.

My assembly tip comes with some good advice and words to the wise (or perhaps words to the dumb and dumber...) The morale of this story is to keep the friggin' bottle of CA well away from the aileron torque rods. Yes, I did it. Even after saying to myself, "Now be very careful not to get any CA on the torque tube..."; somehow it just finds the closest, most direct line to disaster and frustration.

I speak of my brand new Q40 Polecat. I had heard that it is a good idea to soak the wing mounting blocks inside of each wing panel with CA to ensure any punky wood in this area is hardened so that pressure applied by the wing bolts will not crush or collapse the wing panel. I have since discovered that this is likely not necessary on Bruce's Polecats now, but maybe it was a good idea on early ones. Anyway, my story (and the lesson) continues...

So I have a brand new 2 oz. bottle of thin CA. I clip off the end of the

applicator nozzle and proceed to go to work...all the while repeating, "Now be very careful not to get any CA on the torque tube..." Starting at the front block, I begin to apply a liberal amount of thin CA to the target area. All is well. Things begin to smoke and vapor gets in my eyes. It now begins to go downhill from here.

Confident that my application technique is second only to similar skills of a brain surgeon, I move to the rear blocks. At this point the dreaded CA Demons of Modeling descend upon my workshop and my very first brand-new Polecat. Against all laws of physics, except perhaps capillary action, the CA finds its way to the brass torque tube. At first, Denial floods the brain cells, and the delicate application of more CA continues. Then Realization of what has actually happened pushes Denial from the rapidly firing neurons in my brain. Then Panic quickly sets in...I drop the bottle of CA to the floor and begin frantically moving the aileron back and forth to reinforce the Denial that says, "You didn't get CA in the torque tub, did you?" Within seconds of trying to make everything Okie-Dokie by rapidly flexing the aileron back and forth, the force required to continue said flexing action quickly increases. The torque tube begins to squeak, and all movement rapidly comes to a grinding halt. Anger now fills the air of the workshop, and the house cat runs for the hills as a blood curdling scream is heard throughout the land. "NO...0000000......!!!"

Before opening my wallet and emailing Bruce for a new wing panel, I take a few deep breaths and step away from the work bench. Perhaps this problem, which is clearly the fault of the CA Demons of Modeling, can be solved by some creative engineering, a sharp Dremel tool, and some acetone.

If you have read this far, you have reached my assembly tip. To solve

the above "Welded Aileron" problem, simply cut through the surface of the wing panel with a small Dremel bit and open up the aluminum torque tube so that it looks like a "C" shape along its entire length. Apply acetone to the opening in the tube with a syringe and begin to work the aileron back and forth. One or two beers and lots of patience will yield a relatively free aileron. The dried CA will dissolve and turn goopy and then make its way to the opening in the tube. Scrape away the CA residue with an Exacto knife or a small brass brush. Finally, apply a liberal amount of silicone based spray lubricant to the opening in the tube. Open another beer, and continue wiggling the aileron back and forth. Problem solved; Demons gone. The scars of the wing surgery can be almost entirely hidden by the Polecat canopy and a little tape if you can color match some tape to your paint job. In my case, the affected area is white so some white tape did the job nicely.







Moral of this story once again: "Keep the friggin' bottle of CA well away from the aileron torque rods" and "Do as I say, not as I do."
