District 6, Steve Baker

The 2008 racing season officially started in the Mid-Atlantic region as the PGRC hosted its first contest, a 424-only Q-500 opener. A total of 11 contestants signed up to compete in what would soon be remembered as the "7-11" - No, not because we all had slurpees, but because of the 11 contestants, 7 crashed their planes, and only 1 of the 7 brought a back-up. The following summarizes the "chronology of carnage":

Heat one, Frank Donnelly hits #3 on lap 12, destroying his plane and waking everyone up. Fortunately, Frank brought both a backup airplane and the will to continue.

Heat 2, Round 1 - Having just test flown, Dave Beazley accidentally takes off on high-rate elevator, figures out what is wrong, and when reaching for the rate switch, bumps the elevator stick (full down) and hits about 40 feet from the starting line. Beazley's done.

Next heat, CD Neal Rehm takes out Rick Moreland on the 2nd lap at #2 pylon. Neal's plane survives, but the collision kills the engine. Rick's peculiarly colorful Procrastinator easily finds the ground. Rick's done.

We smooth out and actually fly a clean 2nd Round; however, in Round 3, Dave Latsha - who didn't even bring a plane to the event but is *given* a plane to fly by Neal Rehm - takes out Gene Bass, who was clean and flying well (1:22.45, 1:21.27) up until then. Fortunately, Dave did remember to bring his lucky horseshoe and went on to win the heat. Gene's done.

Round 4, Regis White, our only (maybe *the* only) living charter member of the NMPRA takes himself out, just diving into the ground, full bore. Regis is done.

At the start of round 5, I am the only one clean and holding onto fast time at 1:17.91, and I'm starting to think I could actually win this. Unfortunately, I don't own a lucky horseshoe, and Latsha's was almost worn out of magic. And sure enough, all hell breaks loose. I cut out chasing Frank Donnelly and push him into breaking fast time, my fast time. Frank turns a 1:16.26. DOH!

By this time, everyone still flying has had at least one BYE run. Two heats are skipped all together for lack of entrants. In the same round, Greg Brewer gets his plane so slow on his landing approach that it falls out of the sky and breaks the tail loose. Greg's done.

Round 6, I gotta fly Frank Donnelly again. We both take off clean; I get to pylon 1 first, but he's faster coming back. It soon becomes apparent that I can't catch him and logically start to imagine I'm just not doing my part, not flying as close to the poles, and I ought to fix it right now, because I'm losing. This theory is soon dispelled completely as on lap 4, I nailed #3 with my plane, "The Flying PHOK" (Put Her On Kill, get it?). When it hit, it

sheared off both landing gear legs, ate the prop down to a nub, tore the wing off, and sent the fuselage another 100 feet, motor still chattering away, electronics slinging from the wing opening, then thump. Steve's done.

When the points are finally tallied at the end of 6 rounds, lo and behold, there is a 3-way fly-off for 1st, 2nd and 3rd, with Frank Donnelly, Dave Latsha, and Pete Cooke, aka, the Sleeper. Pete figured the best strategy for him was just to fly and hope the other 2 hurt themselves, so I just planned to keep him informed of any Sure enough, about lap 6, cuts. As for the '09 season in Bowie, I have admit the program needs rebuilding. Fortunately, we have an excellent facility, skilled workers, and now, a free place to house our out-oftown competitors. All we need is a better mix of events and, of course, you, the competitors. Clearly, hosting only 424 events is no longer the answer and amounts to gross underutilization of our facility. Worse still, I believe taking the current "low-road" approach flies in the face of all the work Bob Violett and Cliff Telford did for our club to get racing established in this area. Today, we have one of the very few sites left on the entire East Coast that can host all classes of pylon racing. I plan to start fixing it this fall.

As I stated in my last column, our first race of 2008 was held in Mulberry, FL, and was hosted by the Imperial R/C Club. The "Southern 500" as it has come to be called was a good race, and the weather could not have been better to start off our race year. This race was also the first time that Q-40

was run at their field, and it doesn't look as if it will be the last time either!

Saturday we raced 428 and the first day of 424. Then on Sunday we raced 422 and the second day of 424. There were 17 racers in 428, 16 in 422, and 10 in 424; and everyone had a great time racing. Many of the races were tight races with positions being swapped throughout the race. I think the Imperial club is becoming a favorite race spot for everyone, and the races are attracting more and more racers. The club does an excellent job of hosting the two races they are currently running each year!

Mulberry was also the first test for our new light system that has been developed by our Markham Park Pilots Association crew. For more than two years they have been constantly finetuning the light system that they developed for our district to use. Many of you were able to see this system in use at the Gold Cup race in Ft. Lauderdale in April. The newest addition to the system was to add three cut lights, one for each pylon and also to have each pylon give its own cut instead of using a radio. Each pylon had its own color code so that you knew which pylon you cut and you knew it almost immediately! If you cut the same pylon twice, that pylon light would start blinking. Also if you cut out, the system would not allow any turn lights for pylon one and would also stop timing the racer.

The system worked well and has already been upgraded to take care of some minor technical problems that were discovered while using it. This system now gives faster input for the racers and takes away almost all communication problems. It also works to eliminate many of the operator errors as well, but that will never go away until we have no workers on the course at all.

If you talk with any of the crew from Markham, thank them for their tireless efforts to help make races easier to run for everyone. They made this whole rig very transportable and bring it to all of our races in our district if it is requested for use. They help us to get new clubs into racing by taking away most of the technical issues...just provide the manpower!

In April the Markham Park Pilots Association held the Gold Cup race as well as a 424 race. We had many, many good races, and it was commented that each race was like racing in the finals at the Nationals! I won't give the full results here as they are posted on the NMPRA website, but here are the top five in the Gold Cup: Anthony Hemken, 1st; Randy Bridge, 2nd; Gary Freeman Jr., 3rd; A.J. Seaholm, 4th; and Fred Burgdorf, 5th. A.J. Seaholm also held the fast time with a :59.56!

As most racers know, having your family at the races makes it better as you can spend time with them and also do something fun, a win-win situation! What was nice about this race was the contingent from Guatemala. Talk about a family affair: fathers, sons, and grandfathers, all racing! It was really nice to see, and the little ones gave the 424 racers quite a challenge as they flew quite well. Julio Quevedo took 1st, and I believe he was 10! Sebastian Job flew the fast time of 1:44.49, and I believe he was only 8! Way to go! I look forward to seeing these young guys growing up and becoming a major factor at races.
