The Woodland/Davis Model Club continues to seek areas of refinement on an already high quality and efficient product. Ninety heats (and one fly-off) were flown over the weekend with no re-flies. That is impressive. Those who showed up were treated to great hospitality and some fast/ competitive racing.

The first two rounds of 426 were flown without incident. Lots of close racing action across the board. First heat of Q40 started off with Gino, Robert Holik, and

Round 2 saw Verano and Salazar getting together coming around pylon 3 on the 10th lap. Travis would like to forget Round 3 of 426 as he had to ditch his Vortex trying to avoid takeoff mid-air. However, this allowed Dave Gavin and Jim Padelt to battle for the first-place points. What a close race it was with Dave taking the win by a foot or less (or at least that's how the starter saw it). If Padelt would have had a "challenge flag," he would have thrown it. Mid-airs are always a unfortunate event to deal with; however, when you mid-air after the race is over.....well that's even worse. Unfortunate that was the scenario Mitch West and Gil Lucero found themselves having to deal with. Round 5 was the last O-40 heat for Jim Allen, as his Too Sweet got rear-ended in a landing collision. Without a backup, I'm sure Jim was wondering if his fast time of 0:59.42 would stand up.

The air Sunday morning was fast. In 426, Bruce Coffey turned a 1:02.96, and shortly after that Travis bettered that with a 1:02.26. In Round 6 of Q40 Gino put up a 0:59.56 just 0.14 seconds behind Jim Allen's 0:59.42 turned early Saturday. In Round 8 of 426, for Bruce Coffey and Dan Coe, their race day come to an end with a lap 1 pylon 1 mid-air.

I have really been stung by bad air



over the last couple of years. I know, I know ... if you are out in front, you won't have to worry about bad air. Until I can consistently get out in front and stay there, I need to be aware of the air! It's a bit naive just to settle into a groove around the pylons and expect to be safe. I think there is more to it. You have to adjust elevation and the path around pylons 2 and 3 at every moment during these turns relative to who you are behind, overtaking, nearby, etc. At the same time, I don't like to be one of those guys who is all over the sky. If you don't hold a line, mid-airs will result. I don't know; I need to think about all of this over the winter. If anyone out there has some tips on flying in bad air, I would like to hear them. How about writing an article in this newsletter for all of us?

Immediately upon returning home from the NATS, Calgary hosted their annual pylon contest for Quickie 500 and Q40. The weather was great; there was a good group of pilot entries and lots of close Ted Ellefson of racing to boot. Calgary proudly took home a thirdplace trophy having pressed his daughter Jillian into service as first-time caller. Ted wasn't so proud of the third place trophy as he was to have his daughter call for him in their first race together. He won a trophy to boot! Congratulations Ted and Jillian. You two make a good team. We hope to see more of the Evil Ellefsons.

In early September, the District met in Medicine Hat, Alberta for its first pylon race hosted by the local club. [You are reading this correctly. Two major races to report on, first the fall CAPS championship race held August 24 and 25 flown at the premier flying site in Muncie - the nicest field you could ever fly at. The weather was very nice for practice on Friday and two separate race days Saturday and Sunday. Five rounds of 424 and 426 were flown along with four rounds of EF-1. At the end of the day, Kevin Matney came out on top followed by Jeff Adamisin and Jim Nikodem. Kevin posted one of three times less than 1:22 (that is on the short course), but was inched out by .03 seconds by Darwin Larson who came in fourth for the day. 424 had a field of 15. In 426 Jay Cappis ended up on top, holding on to the fast time for the day for Late in the day Mike a while. Spencer posted a very impressive 1:03.85. His teammate Mike Eden



was second and Dub Jett was third. The next fastest time was set by Tom Scott with a 1:06.21. 426 had 13 entries. EF-1 had only four rounds and ten entries, and at the end of the day everyone in lane one had a perfect score. It was decided to go by time, so Jim Nikodem was first with a 1:25.04 (also on the short course), Mike Helsel was second (1:27.92), Dub Jett third (1:28.07), and Darwin Larson 4th (1:31.59). Sunday was on the long course for 424 and 1/4 40, both with 14 entries. Jim Nikodem ended up on top in 424 followed by teammate Darwin Larson with the fast time of the day (1:35.94). Bernie Vanderleest in 3rd. There was a 6-way tie for first in 1/4 40 (all down 4 points for the day) which was settled by multiple flyoffs. At the end of it all the order from first to sixth was Lonnie Finch, Terry Frazer, Santiago Panzardi, Mo Vereecke, John Gibson (in his first 1/4 40 race), and Duane Hulen. Once again a great race at a great field we are fortunate to race at four days a year (two races) plus the NATS!

Next was the September 7th North Central Pylon League, Brooklyn Park Minnesota, 426 cash prize race. It was a truly fun time for seven of us from southern district 5 to take part in one of their wellrun races. Twenty-seven total fliers took part in this outstanding one-day race. The NCPL switched a few years back from the OS 46 motor to the Quickey Jett 426 motor. They hold a bunch of oneday races throughout the summer, but designate one late in the season as a cash prize race. That's right, thanks to Jerry Elert there was \$2400 in prize money AND a drawing for two Quickey Jett Motors and a fully composite Randy Etkin R-200 airplane. That's not all!! pizza and beer included!! Here is how it works; the top ten finishers are in the drawing for the cash prizes. First place gets first pick of the ten envelopes and on down the line. The top envelope, pulled purely by chance, was \$400. Every flier was in the drawing for the hardware. That was enough to get some to make the trip up to MN, but even without that, they are a really fun group who put on a really nice race. They run things a little differently from what most are used to. No light system, or turn lights, and no idea of cuts until the end of the race. No

I have to mention the 100-foot-tall mound of dirt bordering one side of the field. You just have to see it. Not a problem, but it takes a little getting used to. Six rounds were flown in temperatures in the 90's - pretty hot conditions for Minnesota. Five guys drove in one vehicle from the Kansas/ Kansas City area. One of those was Lonnie Finch, who won the day in a flyoff with Darwin Larson from Wisconsin. Third and fourth were also settled by a flyoff. AJ Hemkin (last year's district Champion and Caudron trophy winner) ended up in third, and Jaryl Smith was fourth. Thank you NCPL and Jerry Elert for a truly fun time.



Time for an update on our progress with Fun Fighters as a way to introduce pylon racing to metro clubs in Brisbane and recruit pilots to "real" pylon racing.

Bruce de Chastel and I ran our fourth Fun Fighter pylon contest in Brisbane last weekend. The previous three had been at my club field at Tingalpa, which is centrally located in Brisbane, only 9 km from the Brisbane CBD. Last weekend's comp was at the SAAMBR field in Brisbane's northern suburbs.

The comp attracted strong interest from the hosting club, which has 200+ members. We had seven pilots from the club race on the day, two of whom were committee members and another 20 club members came along to watch and help. We also had a group of four first-time pilots from the Gold Coast club south of Brisbane who have caught the Fun Fighter racing bug. To round the contest out, we had a father and two sons team, who have a background in control line combat and team race competition attending their second Fun Fighter event with Grandad running their pit support.

The highlight was the Family team with Dad placing first and his two sons coming fifth and sixth. These guys have a background in competition and look likely to progress to Q500 next year with any luck.





The local club members and the guys from the Gold Coast really enjoyed racing for the first time. There was a lot of carnage, all due to dumb thumbs, but no one got upset or depressed about it. We lost two models in practice and another five during the racing. I think the low cost is the real beauty of the Fun Fighters. No one was upset about losing a model. It's only \$100 and an hour's work and you are airborne again. What I did notice was that none of the pilots from my own club, who have flown in previous contests at their field, travelled to this comp. It appears the reality is that most pilots will compete at their own field but don't want to travel to another field to compete. The flip side of that is that the pilots who do get the bug and start to follow the contests are a good chance of taking the next step to Vipers and serious pylon racing.

Our aim in organising these Fun Fighter pylon race meetings is Primarily, we want to twofold. attract new pilots to pylon racing who will catch the bug and take the step to serious racing. It will have been worth the effort of the three comps we are running this year if we can get two or three committed new pylon racers into the fold. Secondly, we are introducing all the main clubs in Brisbane to pylon racing and getting it accepted, which will open up the opportunity in the future to holding F5D and Q500 events in the metro area. Bruce has made a major effort over the last two years to develop F5D pylon racing in Oueensland, and these Fun Fighter race meetings are laying the ground work for future F5D racing in the metro area.

On that score, the trials to select the Australian F5D team for Austria next year is on at Maryborough on the first weekend of October. I will report on that in my next letter.
