
EF-1 finished with Steve Baker and his caller Terry Frazer taking the top spot. Steve flew a stock Great Planes Proud

Bird. It was great to see that ARF's were just as competitive as custombuilt models. I have designed several airplanes, and this year I decided to go the ARF route to show just how competitive and how closely matched they are. This year I flew a shoestring for every round and had fast time right up until my flyoff with Jim Katz, who cruised by in the flyoff to steal the fast time trophy from me. I am not bitter at all; seriously, I am not, and I really don't wish to talk about it anymore. Congrats, Jimmy "MEOW" Katz, for taking home the fast time.

New for 2014 was the addition of the standard class for EF-1. Basically, the standard class consisted of the pilots with the most points but didn't turn a time faster than 1:22. The Standard champion was Trey Witte, 2nd was Craig Greening (new to our pylon events but no stranger to competition), and 3rd was Masamiki Konno.

426 had some of the closest and tightest racing I have seen in several years. In the end Jim Allen was victorious flying his Quick V 6. This was a wood wing, fully Monokoted Q-500 model. Matt Fehling finished second and had fast time. The finals this year featured a departure from the normal 1-3 & 2-4 start sequence. In the finals for both QM and 426 race horse starts were used.

422 was won by Matt Fehling, flying a Strega. Fast time was won by Dr. Dolittle (Roy Andrassy) from Canada flying the new Miss Dara.





District 5: Jim Nikodem

May 30-June 1 was a big weekend in Kansas City. In the second year of the Heartland Speed Freakz, they held their first KC race and first Q40 race at that field. Short course 424 and 426 Saturday, and long course 424 and Q40 Sunday. This was one of two KC races along with two races in Kansas, all thanks to Lonnie Finch and Moe Vereeke. These two guys stepped up to put on these races and are doing an outstanding job. Everything worked well with no reflys all weekend and some very tight racing. There was a flyoff in each event at the end of each dav.

On Saturday Ben Hobbs did very well in 424, staying calm and winning the first 5 rounds with a Viper; he also got fast time with a 1:24.39. Unfortunately the wing blew off his viper during the 6th (He's still not happy we flew a 6th round, LOL) and final round resulting in a 3-way tie for first place. His backup was a Scat Cat looking sonic with a tired motor, resulting in a 3rd place finish after the flyoff. Ken VanTuyl and I were battling it out for several laps in the flyoff when Ken cut, giving me 1st place and landing him in 2nd. Duane Gall beat a few more state-of-the-art airframes in 426 with a SCAT CAT, taking 3rd overall after a flyoff with Moe giving him 2nd place. I was pretty consistent all day, dropping only 2 points and ended up taking 1st place. Moe ended the day with a fast time of 1:06.41.

Sunday's action was just as exciting. Duane Gall bested the field in 424, not dropping a point all day. There was a 3-way tie among myself, Ken VanTuyl, and new comer Tom Melshiemer for 2nd – 4th. Ken and I were once again battling, swapping the lead back and forth, until Ken repeated Saturday's performance and cut, giving me the 2nd place finish and him 3rd place. Tom was flying his backup, and the engine just wasn't quite there. Some guys in Q40 were having trouble with the downwind takeoffs but not Duane Hulen; he dominated even with getting a zero when one of his elevators delaminated. Duane Gall continued the tradition of flying something a little different when he brought out his Wittman Tailwind. The two Duane's were tied for 1st at the end of the day. but Duane G had a 10-hour drive back to Colorado and opted out of the flyoff. Gordon McWilliams took 3rd using a couple of different Pole Cats.

Overall it was a great weekend. The turnout was a little low, but hopefully more pilots will come to the next race. As an added incentive to get pilots there, HSF has purchased a Jett 426 motor that will be given away at the fall race. Every pilot who registers gets a ticket for the raffle.

The next weekend was the annual Greater Cincinnati R/C Club race CD'd by Tom Scott. The weather for practice Friday and racing Saturday was ideal. The Saturday night dinner at the field was outstanding as usual. It is worth going to the contest just for that! Thanks to the club and more importantly the club wives for putting that on. It was outstanding! Oh yeah, there was racing too. Six rounds plus flyoffs of EF1, 424, and 426, all on the 2.0 mile course, were flown. In EF 1 Dan Kane and Dub Jett flew off for first with Dan winning and getting fast time for the day. Tom Melsheimer was third after winning his flyoff. In 424 Kevin Matney dominated with first place on Saturday and fast time. A local club member who flies one race a year, Mark Feist, was second, and Miki Koo (another local) was third. Second and third were settled by a flyoff. Another flyoff determined first thru third in 426 sort of. Dub Jett did not take off. and Mike Helsel and Tom Scott mid-aired. So it was settled by time. Mike first, Tom second, and Dub third.

Sunday morning had some rain go through, forcing some anxious fliers into a rain delay. After the rain it was windv and cold. EF 1 was flown on the 2.0 mile course, and 424 and 1/4 40 was on the long course. At the end of the day, Jim Nikodem came out on top followed by Tim Lampe with the same number of points and a fast time 1/100th slower time, followed by Jay Cappis in third. 424 had Jim Nikodem first after a flyoff with Jay Cappis (second), and Tom Melsheimer (third). Kevin Matney got fast time again, but later blew his good motor's rear bearing. Q40 saw Mike Helsel come out on top. Teamate Dub Jett was second with the fast time of 1:02.85, and third after a flvoff with John Gibson and Richard Oliver was Tom Scott.

The end of June was the Bloomington IL NATS warm up. Perfect time to get some practice and get an airplane or two dialed in. All three events will be flown at the NATS too. EF-1, 424, and 426 were flown as separate Saturday and Sunday races. The weather worked out well for practice with the pylons on Friday and over the weekend. CD Jay Cappis had everything in order for a very smooth weekend. All events were flown on the short (2.0 mile) course which makes things nice and easy, 426 was dominated by Mo Vereecke getting first both days, and fast time was done by Mo Saturday and Duane Hulen Sunday, who got a personal fast time in the event with a brand new airplane ready for the NATS.

Darwin Larson did well in 424 both days with fast time and first place on Saturday. Duane Hulen did the same on Sunday with a fast time more than two seconds faster. Tim Lampe was second in 424 on Sunday. That was his fourth 424 race ever against a very experienced group of fliers. Tim is our local World Championship F5D flier. He did get some practice in for that event with his glider-looking electric racer. Tim will compete in Austria in August as part of the US Team.

We had 10 pilots in EF-1, with Jim Katz leading the way with 3rd place, Mike Helsel in 5th place, and Mike Langlois in 8th place! Good job, guys! Our three entries in 424 were Jerry Salisbury in 23rd, David Gay in 22nd, and Trey Witte in 4th place. Way to go, guys, and thanks for helping the 424 event be successful at the NATS! In 426 we had 13 pilots in the finals with Matt Fehling taking 2nd & fast time, Mike Helsel in 6th, Dean Stone in 9th and Mark Parker in 10th. In Q40 we also had 13 pilots in the finals with John McDermott in 5th, Gary Freeman Jr. in 6th, Bill Johanson in 7th, and Dean Stone in 10th. Oh, yeah, and Mr. Matt Fehling winning Q40 and finishing 2nd in 426 for the overall NATS championship! Way to go, Matt; we are all so proud of you!!!

I asked Matt to write us a few words about his experience, and here is what he had to say:

I just want to take a moment to thank all the people that keep the Nats being what it is, a truly great pylon experience worth the price of admission year in and year out. Thanks to the people on site like Mike Condon, Pete Bergstrom, Tom Scott, and J.C. Witte for their efforts and orchestrating the help, in addition to the people like Dan Kane who work the other 364 days making sure a race takes place. Very few heats had to be redone this year, which really kept the hours of competition down; luckily the weather held out and turned out to be very pleasant. I really enjoyed the racehorse starts this year in the finals and think that there were no problems since Muncie has plenty of real estate. Otherwise, it was business as usual and ran like a well-oiled machine. This was my 10th Nats attended; the first was 2004 when my parents brought me to Muncie as a 424 pilot to spectate. Muncie week has become a tradition to the Fehling family, the same for many of you.

It was a tough year for me following an incident at Tangerine this December, undoubtedly the lowest of lows I've experienced in pylon and one of the worst in my life. I want to take a second to thank some individuals that picked me up after

We can't always win, so it's enjoying the company and experiences in every situation that has to be cherished. I had also asked Barry Reade to write a race re-cap from the Hodges race in Andersonville, Georgia last month, and here it is for you also:

Hodges Hobbies Summer Fling June 28, 2014

Georgia had its first pylon race since September of 2011 on June 28, 2014. It was a one-day race, and we had 16 424 pilots and 9 EF1 pilots competing. Brad Clayton and I were the CDs and their efforts paid off with a great day of racing. One of the reasons pylon racing stopped in Georgia was that they couldn't get any course workers other than the racers themselves. And, as everyone knows, that is a long hard day racing and manning the course also. This is a problem at other places around the country also. Brad had an idea and contacted Boy Scout Troop 21 in Americus. GA and had them run the course. I went down to Americus two weeks before the race and set up the light system and had training for the Scouts. We bought their lunches



and supplied them with water and drinks for the day as well as made a \$250 donation to their troop for their excellent assistance. We did not have to run any heats over due to problems on the course. The Scouts were happy with the funds they got and are ready to come run the course at the next race, and the racers were happy that all they had to do was race. It was a win-win situation for all. Brenda and Kelly Reade prepared lunch with dawgs and burgers for lunch with baked beans. cole slaw. and all the condiments you could ask for. For \$5 you got two dawgs or burgers and all the rest plus a bag of chips and a drink. Both Friday and Saturday they had water and drinks on ice available for .50 cents each. Hodges is pretty remote, and since Mac closed the Hobby Shop, there wasn't a soda machine on site. They also found out that most racers did not do breakfast on race day, and in the future we will just have drinks and coffee available on race day for breakfast. I had met a fellow on RC Groups who was interested in racing. He raced 2pole and was interested in 3-pole racing. I went over to his field to fly with him about 100 miles away and after meeting him asked if he would be the starter for the day at the race. His name was BJ Swope, and he showed up, driving 200 miles to the race venue. I asked Trey Witte to train him as he has a lot of starter experience, and he did a great job of starter for the

day. Hopefully he will get some racer airplanes together and compete at the next race.





District 7 Continued:

Rick and Kim Grim showed up to watch and call for their son Adam Grim. and Kim volunteered to be the announcer for the day. She had been announcing two-pole Club 40 races for years, and she sure made the day progress smoothly calling up each heat: who was in the 1st ready box and who was in the 2nd ready box. They ran one round of EF1, then a round of 424 all day, and we took a 30 minute lunch for the course workers and back to finish the 5 rounds of racing. Scott Smith helped out with the matrix and the race software which was the icing on the cake as I was still on a vertical learning curve with the software and didn't have it down pat. We lost a couple of EF1 pilots in practice with airplane problems/crashes and gained another 424 pilot with a loaner airplane. The course was measured out and was on the money. It was a very fast morning

with Mike Helsel setting the initial fast time in 424, and then Scott Smith set a new fast time. In the next round Mike again set fast time, and then Scott set a faster time. The next round Mike Helsel set a fast time of 1:18.49. and that time held for the rest of the day. Mike Helsel was the winner for the day and fast time: Dale Harwell was second; and Bill Johansson was third. The course was very fast. Humidity, barometric pressure, temperature all came together to make it a fast day. The only possible negative was the heat and the South Georgia bugs. EF1 was also hard fought all day, and Bill Johansen and James Barr tied for the top honors with Bill getting the win and James having fast time. We ran the EF1's on the 424 short course so we didn't have to move the pylons and workers from round to round. Brad made the award plaques, and we gave awards for the 1st thru 3rd places and fast time in each class. Everyone was on their way home by 4 pm.

Hopefully we can run two one-day races next time with 424 and 426 being run both days at the next race. Barry Reade

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
