Matrix Software Update

The steering committee for the NMPRA Matrix software is making good progress towards the objective of having a new piece of software released to the organization for early October. The committee participated in a conference call just prior to the Phoenix Q40 Classic in February, A critical decision was made in terms of which path to proceed down. The project team was very fortunate to get some much needed help from Paul Herman, the original designer and code writer for the NMPRA Race software. Paul has provided the team with the missing source code files that were needed to piece the old source code together and to understand how some of features and functionality of the existing code works.

With these missing files now in hand we will be able to modify, change, rewrite, re-design Paul's NMPRA Race software and develop a 2016 version of his software. The 2016 version will implement some much needed improvements in how the Matrix is created and laid out as well as significant improvements in early race repeats, back to back races, etc. Chuck Andraka is presently doing much of the re-design work and some coding of the matrix creation routines. Our goal is to have a workable "alpha" version of the software in place for use at the NATS in July. By using it at the NATS, Chuck will get some valuable feedback on what works and what needs tweaking as we move towards a Beta version that can be tested by a wider audience.

The software development cycle is progressing nicely, and the team is on track to the plan. If you or your club would like to get involved by becoming a Beta tester for one of your local races later this summer and early fall, please contact Randy Smith. The software steering committee will be looking for Beta testers. Stay tuned for more updates. – Randy Smith

AMA Rules Cycle / Proposals Hello All,

The AMA 2-year rules cycle has come around again. The cutoff for Basic

proposals is now behind us on March 15th. These proposals, if they pass the required board votes, will take effect as of January 1, 2017. We have several interesting Basic proposals that mostly were submitted in the last few weeks before the cutoff. Be sure to read them carefully and give your feedback to your district representative of the RC Pylon Contest Board. Some of the proposals are fairly straightforward; some are not. Read them carefully and think about the impact to the sport. The proposals can be found on the Competitions page of the AMA web site.

In addition to the basic proposals, we have a couple of Urgent proposals that as of writing this are posted on the AMA web site. They have both passed the Board vote and are posted for the required period for comment prior taking effect in April. These proposals are addressing issues that the Board felt could not wait till the end of the year.

One of the Urgent proposals addresses the need for an engine to replace the discontinued Thunder Tiger Pro 40 (TT40) for 424 Quickie Sport. The 424 Engine Committee has selected the Evolution .46 from Horizon Hobby. The goal was to find a good quality engine that will be available from a reliable source that had the same performance as the current TT40 engine. The TT40 engine has served us so well for nearly 20 years; we were very spoiled. We need to thank Thunder Tiger for keeping guality and consistency of the engine so stable for so long. After extensive testing over about a year, the Evo 46 engine has been found to be basically the same performance as the thousands of TT40 engines in the hands of racers today. With the Evo engine being a .46, it was necessary to revise the rules to raise the displacement limit and a few other details for the Evo. The Evo will be the ONLY .46 allowed at this time, and it will compete equally with the TT40. Any other .46 engines would have to go through the same testing before

go through the same testing before they could be considered for the class. No engines will be approved that

would obsolete the TT40 and Evo 46 by having superior horsepower. The other Urgent proposal addresses an issue that was brought to light recently. This proposal makes it illegal to use onboard glow systems in any of the AMA pylon events. This is a technology that has been utilized in F3D pylon in recent years with very good success in increasing performance. How it does this is by allowing the compression to be lowered by raising the head while still staying on the pipe and allowing the engine to unload notably more in the air, resulting in more speed. A flat coil (Glo-Bee style) plug is used, like F3D, and kept glowing for the entire flight. The pilots using the system at the recent Phoenix QM race, Gino DelPonte and AJ Hemken, didn't go dramatically faster than several other racers, but they were still working on the engine set-up trying to take advantage of the system. Gino did set fast time with a 59.60 but there were 7 others with 59 second times. Once sorted out, the set-up has potential for a notable increase in performance. After much discussion among the attendees at the Phoenix race. including Gino, the Board members in attendance decided to write a proposal to stop the use of onboard glow systems before the technology is allowed to increase the performance of the event. It was felt that the event didn't need to go any faster than it is today, and we did not need to allow the increased cost and complexity of the models to be competitive. So, now is your chance to have input on the future of our sport. Carefully read the proposals and give your opinions to your district Board member. You can find out who they are on either the AMA or NMPRA web sites along with their e-mail addresses. Keep in mind that your Board member has to take into account all of the input from his district so his final vote might not agree with your input. He will do his best to represent what his district wants. Be a part of the process. Have a great racing season!!



The new Model Tracker (worker-less) lighting and judging system is on track to make its first field test using real pylon aircraft on a real pylon course this spring in Calgary. Hank's intensive development continues. Stay tuned. You have likely seen Gino and Mike Del Ponte, AJ Hemkin, Jim Katz and Mike Langlois use a stopwatch for timing their model in a race from pylon #3 to pylon #1. They pretty much ignore the turn light and use only the watch to determine when the model will be at pylon #1 for the turn. (Who needs turn lights anyway?!!!!) Kevin Umbach from our district has developed a very cool app for your iPhone that does the same thing and



has other cool features as well. The app allows you to set the interval, fine tune it up or down; there is a Caller count feature that simulates your caller's cadence, speed calculation, data logging of each lap and each race. I believe the app uses iOS 8 or later. IPhone 4S or later or any relatively new iPod would work as well. The app has not been developed for Android or Windows devices.

I have tried other motors, but have never had a problem with the E Flight motor. Make sure you get the right one. You are looking for the power 25, 1250 kv. Recently I switched to the Rimfire motor from Tower Hobbies. Not sure which is better.

In my opinion, the best battery is the Turnigy nanotech 4 cell 2.7 (2700 ma) 65-130c discharge, \$40 or so from Hobby King. The battery is the most important component in the power system. Motors and speed controllers are all the same in my opinion. I order them with the 4mm bullet connectors. You might need some 4 mm bullets to put on your speed controller. Other guys use a deans plug. Either way works. I would just rather buy them with the connector I want. Also, make sure you order from a US warehouse with Hobby King, otherwise the shipping will take a long time from China. Any 60 amp or more speed controller with a BEC will work. I have tried a bunch, and have only had trouble with the Hobby King red brick, but real good luck with the 60 amp blue BEC, also from Hobby King. I do not use a receiver battery since the BEC reserves some juice for the radio when the voltage gets low. Bad for the batteries anyway to run them all the way down. You should not have to put back more than 1800-2000 ma. If you do, you are hurting the battery. Charge at 4 amps. At least that's what I do. Anyway, any 60 amp speed controller with a BEC will work, and any smart charger will work. Does not have to be fancy, just has to have a LiPo setting.

As far as practicing for racing, practice straight, full power take-offs. You can do this without someone holding your airplane if you are taking off from pavement or very short grass. You will need some right rudder at first, gradually taking it out as the airplane accelerates. These are great sport flying airplanes too. They do great aerobatics if you want to goof around with them. I do this a lot with an old Horizon Shoestring. By the way, Dan Kane flew one of these airplanes at the NATS, I believe two years ago, and



had fast time with it for most of the day. From my experience, fast time is set at the coldest temperature, so early in the day. Do yourself a favor and be warmed up prior to the first race. I like to practice the Friday before a race.

That's it. Pretty simple, and NO secrets.

Scarlet Screamer ARF and Shoestring ARF EF-1's

have had a few people asking advice, so I decided in this newsletter to share my view on the event with everyone. The great thing about this event is that there are no big secrets. All equipment is readily available and fairly inexpensive. All the airplanes go real close to the same speed (in my opinion). It always looks faster when the top guys are flying a really good course. That is true with any event. Let a really good pilot fly your airplane,

and see how fast it goes!

EF1 is a great event. I think it really comes down to flying more than anything, but having the right equipment helps. The Proud Bird is a real good choice. Another is the Miss Dara from Nitroplanes. It is very reasonably priced, but the down side is that it is heavy and needs lighter gear and wing attach bolts, not that big a deal now that the minimum weight is 3.5 pounds. It can definitely be raced "out of the box." You can get real close to the weight limit by replacing the monster wing attach bolts with hardware store ones. The Dara gear is much too heavy and highly swept. I use Great Planes dural landing gear (GPMQ1800). Other good EF-1's are the World Models Scarlet Screamer / Outrageous EF-1's. There are others, but the bottom line is that the best airplane is the one you are most comfortable with. There is no barn burner airplane. Low aspect ratio or high aspect ratio, no big difference in my opinion. Remember, aviation is a series of compromises.


As a new EF1 pilot, however, be careful on go-arounds. A lot more torque than other airplanes and quick throttle response make for a bad combination. You will go around at some point because these airplanes are very clean aerodynamically and hard to slow down with a very flat glide. When you do go around, add some right rudder and no more than half throttle (ease it in, not all at once).

Our 2015 local awards dinner was no different and as usual a boat load of fun and good eats for all. Congratulations again to all the winners. Our 2016 business meeting produced some notable events. Second place overall 2015 standardclass pilot Guy (Buddy) Beaudoin Jr. stepped up as NEPRO president. Thank you, Buddy, and thank you, Bobby, for your service to our group. Present contest director and reasonably newly minted standardpilot, Joel Lang informed our group that he asked for and received a second race date in June. His former one-day event will now extend an additional day. It was determined that three EF-1 events would be held in district 6 for the 2016 racing season. In addition, provisions would be made to better accommodate the difference in course configurations of EF-1 and AMA 424 while at the same time working within the limits of race-day time, worker availability, and electronic course equipment limitations. In 2016, all EF-1 pilots will be expected to race in three consecutive heats without recharging.

In addition, a local ruling regarding "E-500" standard class pilots competing with electrics in our otherwise wet competitions was amended with regard to the use of five-cell batteries as follows: In an effort to help grow our racing base, we are allowing electrics to race with TT40's and Evo 46's in the standard-class. Rules are as follows: any legal non composite wing quickie allowed in AMA 424. Any legal EF-1 ".25"-sized electric motor, any legal 4S lipo battery pack (up to 325 grams) a 75-100 amp controller and any propeller combination. You may also use a 5S 2700ma battery pack: however, only the QM40 APC 7.4 x 7.6 prop is allowed. (LP 07476C). Electrics



will not be allowed to compete in the expert class.

Our Sportsmen class remains unchanged. If a single sportsmen pilot shows, we will mobilize the entire force of NEPRO to ensure success.

Lloyd Burnham and others spoke to the importance of joining our national group. Noting, 1) the importance of favorable AMA special-interest-group numbers in light of the specialized nature of our sport, 2) the changing nature of the hobby in general, and 3) the importance for continued favorable support from AMA leadership noting that if we don't have a specialized group that has identified themselves there is no one to support. NMPRA is this group.

I am currently working with one local contest director to produce a race flier for inclusion in the master race schedule, and with our current local president am also working to produce a flier where one might otherwise not be available. Please stand by for both. Thank you, Calvin Stewart, for coming up with the idea for a generic race program. Thank you, Kevin Cyr, for your great help in our restart of the NEPRO website, hoping for even better with the time remaining before the start of the 2016 season.

District 7: Scott Smith

Well, winter is officially over, and I hope all of you are out turning laps and attending contests. I know I feel about 50% ready for the season and could really use a few more weeks to get some new equipment ready to go, but time waits for no man! I guess I will just have to make time where I can to get it all sorted out and do the best I can in the meantime. I know we all like new stuff, but we all know that our old beater plane has a proven past and probably won't let us down anyway. Our first event in the SEMPRA district for the 2016 season was the 12th annual Southern 500 in Mulberry, FL on March 18-20. This was our 26th event (24 AMA pylon races and 2 FAI team selections) and the first time rain ever became an issue! Practice on Friday went well with about 20 pilots turning laps and getting ready. We did a Friday registration, and because of it we were able to get rolling by 9 AM on Saturday. With ominous skies and a huge front heading our way, we got the short course 424 & 426 events underway. Things were running well until the 1st heat for 426 in round 3 when the skies finally let go. Around 1:30 PM I held a meeting with my course judges and the pilots, and we called the events for the day and agreed to begin back on Sunday morning at 8:00 AM (15 minutes after sunrise!). Sunday got rolling well, but the very first heat Matt Fehling destroyed the steel pole at pylon one, taking out the flag and all the turn one lights! After a 40 minute clean-up and light testing (so much for the early start!), we were back underway. Craig was closing on Steve, getting bad air, saving the plane numerous times, and on the very last lap off turn one, midairing with Steve and losing the plane. There was another heat (can't remember who the pilot was!) but coming around two/three the trailing Q40 did a complete snap roll and continued his pursuit like it never happened! There was some really tight racing all day long, with 5 rounds completed by 3:30 PM. We even had three 59 second times, as well as a new Q40 record by Matt Fehling of 58.54! Very fast air once the cold front pushed the hot, wet front out of the way. I have to thank my club for hanging in there and supporting us through less than perfect conditions. You know what a great bunch you have when the times get tough, and they have proven to be the best! Thanks to the Imperial R/C Club for all the support. The results for the weekend events are posted on the next page.

Our next race will be in Sunrise, FL at Markham Park. This will be 424 and 426 short course on Saturday and 424 and 422 long course on Sunday with practice all day Friday for all registered participants. This event will honor the SEMPRA membership discounts for all registered SEMPRA pilots. Ray Brown is in need of 424 pilots to commit to attending, or else the 424 class will have to be dropped. So if you plan to attend and fly 424, let Ray know ASAP.

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

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
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
