It was brought to our attention recently by a member, Bob Troup from Ohio, that the part number, on the exploded view, for the wrist pin of the Evolution 46 is incorrect. The correct number is EVO100213 or E46213. If you have recently purchased any spare parts or installed a wrist pin in your EVO 46, please double check it. The correct length of the wrist pin is 19 mm. The incorrectly listed part is only 17 mm.

You can't control the weather. That has been the theme lately. The Kansas City race at the end of April was rained out. The forecast was so bad that on the Wednesday prior a mass email went out to cancel. It is still in the process of being rescheduled, not easy working around other club events already scheduled. Check the NMPRA forum for updates. Thanks to Duane Hulen for settling this race up once again!

The next week was the second annual "Spring Thaw Pylon School" in Muncie. The forecast was not great, but the rain stopped Friday afternoon, and many practice flights were flown. Saturday was clear and a little windy, but that is good practice in my opinion. Lots more practice flights took place around the poles. You get what you get on race day. This is a two-day school/practice put on by Tom Melsheimer. It is a Friday/Saturday event meant to provide experienced advice to people new to racing. It is also an opportunity to trim out those new airplanes. The pylons were up, and the Gator and improved trailer were available to move people and equipment back and forth. A quality event.

Tom, with the help of Mark Zeil (a former giant scale racer) came up with a wireless system that uses two workers and that provides a paper copy with some very useful numbers. The top of the printout shows cuts. The next block of data shows the total time past pylon 1, and 2/3. The next block shows time past the pylons for each lap. The last block is lap and total times. By the way, unlike our system USRA has the turn light on only when the airplane is beyond the pylon. This system is the same, so you want to get the shortest light you can consistently do. A blinker every time is the ideal, but very few are in that league. There are still a few bugs to work out, but it is coming along. Great feedback! Thank you Tom, and thanks for a great event! Look for this

event next year, two weeks prior to the first Muncie Race.

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Two weeks later was the Muncie "Indy Shootout." Once again, we had to work around the weather. Almost all those pre-registered were there despite the forecast. They were rewarded with five rounds each day of five total events. This will be a quick rundown since the deadline is approaching. Mike Helsel came out on top of EF-1, and Jim Nikodem got second and fast time. The big news was Daniel Troup. Now 15 years old and racing for the last three years or so, Daniel is flying like a veteran. He was down on points for some reason, but had the fourth fastest time of the day, right up there with the best EF-1



fliers in the country! In 424 Tom Melsheimer came out on top, and Mark Zeil had second and fast time. In 426, Dan Kane was first and fast time (1:05.46), with Dennis Cranfill second, with second fastest time. Mike Eden earned third in a three way fly-off for third. Nineteen total entries in 426 made this the most popular event of the weekend. Q40 was next with seventeen!

Sunday was a bit of a late start due to drizzle, but five rounds were completed, and the weather was pretty nice all day and gorgeous by the time we finished. 424 and 1/4 40 were both flown on the long course. Jim Nikodem won 424 in a fly-off with Mark Zeal. Augie Haupt won third in a flyoff. The big news was once again Daniel Troup with the second fastest time of the day, only half a second slower than the leader. Truly outstanding! In the big event of the weekend. Mike Helsel took first with a 1:03.48 fast time. Dennis Cranfill took second in a fly-off, and second year Q40 pilot Tim Lampe took third with a 1:06.36! There were four guys in their first or second year of Q40 in the field. When it was all over, CAPS raffled off some prizes. Clint Saver won a 424 airplane almost ready to fly. Doug Scherrer won a Quicky Jett motor, and Tom Scott donated an evolution motor won by an EF-1 flier.

Many thanks to Mike Deneve and Tom Melsheimer for doing the matrix, a very important job not many are willing to tackle. Tom Scott is always there to fix or troubleshoot the course equipment and Carolyn Martin for doing the prep

Hello all

We have our first 2017 race under our belts here in District 6. Many thank you's to contest director and fellow NMPRA member Joel Lang for your work related to our first "Ellington Early Spring" race that was conducted on the last day of April. Many thank you's too to senior statesmen Irv Thurrott and Dennis Thibodeau for heading up operations at the timers' station and at pylon one, respectively. Many thanks too to our hosting club NCRCC and their volunteers. We had 17 AMA 424 combined matrix AMA 424 pilots and 9 AMA 426 pilots and a successful event overall. New England weather especially early on in District 6 changes by the minute, and there were no surprises in this department at the start of our season. A midday rain shower and distant thunder interrupted racing. Thank you to past NEPRO president Bob Triggs and his helpers for your lightning fast response in retrieving the required key components of our judgeman lighting system in advance of a potential soaking. We used the time well and broke for lunch while racers had a chance to catch up on related things at the start of a new season.

For the second time that I can remember the recently constructed pavilion provided shelter from weather on race day. I was again glad to know that our local group in combination with hosting club volunteers played a small part in its

purchase and construction. That is to say, the modest proceeds from past and present race events represent both a positive byproduct and passion for r/c competition. I hope and trust that we can continue and endure maintaining our long racing history that directly supports these types of long term investments and racing. Foremost, I can't think of another flying event at my home field that would have had similar success or even a chance of taking place given the forecast and the eventual weather outcome. 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
